¹Prior to a vote being taken on any individual Action Item, or a vote on any other item, public comment will be allowed on the item to be voted on. In the event that the Board member chairing the meeting determines that reasonable rules and restrictions regarding such comment period should be invoked and their view in that regard is supported by a vote of a majority of all Board members present at that meeting, then comments shall be limited as follows: (i) to three minutes per speaker; (ii) for a total of twenty minutes per item; and (iii) with the order of speakers to be determined by the Board member chairing the meeting. Any of these three rules and restrictions may be changed for that specific meeting by a majority vote of all Board members present, but the public comment period must be provided, and the rules and restrictions made applicable to it must be reasonable.
